Mary and Bruce: The speeding concern on Wheaton at the north city limits will be on the next committee #3 agenda. The meeting at one time was going to be held this evening but a committee member could not be present so it is currently set to be held on August 21 with any committee recommendations to be considered at a council meeting later that evening. The engineering department has conducted traffic speed studies previously both prior to and after the speed hump was installed in 2003. The speed hump DID effectively reduce average speeds southbound on Wheaton from 36mph to 28mph but due to the speed hump "noise" and upon neighbor request, it was removed with the Wheaton reconstruction project in 2009. Average speeds then returned to 32mph. At that time there was a 35mph speed limit sign for southbound traffic placed at the north city limits. A few years ago, it was discovered that city ordinance listed the 25mph southbound speed limit changed from 45mph in the Town of Tilden to 25mph at the north city limits and the 35mph sign was changed at that point to 25mph. There isn't presently a reduced speed ahead sign north of the city limits so it is reasonable to expect that southbound traffic will take at least a few hundred feet to slow from 45mph to 25mph. Engineering has again placed traffic counters and will conduct a speed study to determine what speed motorists(northbound and southbound) on Wheaton are traveling at. If a speed issued is found, a potential solution is requesting Chippewa County for a reduced speed 35mph transitional zone on County highway Q(north of the city limits with the appropriate advanced and warning and warning signs)

At or near all city limits for those entering the city, we have signs installed indicating that all city street speed limits, if not posted otherwise are 25MPH. The city does not normally place "reminder" 25mph speed limit signs. Where turning off a higher speed limit street(such as a 35mph or 45mph street), 25mph speed limit signs will be placed on side streets depending on street classification(local, collector, arterial, etc). Engineering can take a look at your request for a "reminder" 25mph sign. Thanks for your continued opinions and concerns about your street. I've copied in city and county staff and council for their reference.

Rick -

It is our understanding that at tonight's Council meeting, the Council will hear a matter regarding the flashing 25 mph speed limit sign located near the 1800 block of Wheaton Street. As residents who lives in this area, we have seen the positive effects of this sign slowing down traffic coming into town. We would encourage the City to maintain this sign in this area.

However, we have noticed that outgoing traffic exceeds the 25 mph speed limit in this area. We believe one of the reasons for this is that there is no 25 mph sign in this area for outgoing traffic. We feel that drivers assume, because it begins to look like a rural area, that the speed limit increases. At one time there was a 25 mph sign posted at the north end of our property. Many years ago the sign was vandalized and was never replaced. We would encourage the City to reinstall a sign in this area again.

**AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING
OPEN-FLAME CANDLES AND FIXTURES**

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHIPPEWA FALLS, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That § 9.025 of the Chippewa Falls Municipal Code be created to provide as follows:

9.025 OPEN-FLAME CANDLES AND FIXTURES

No airborne open-flame device, i.e., sky lantern, may be launched or used, free-floating or tethered in the City of Chippewa Falls. Airborne open-flame devices from neighboring jurisdictions that enter into the City of Chippewa Falls are also prohibited. The term “sky lantern” as used in this section means any airborne lantern typically constructed from paper with a wood, metal or cardboard frame containing a candle or fuel cell composed of a waxy flammable material or other open flame which serves as a heat source to heat the air inside the lantern to cause it to lift into the air. Sky candles, fire balloons and airborne paper lanterns and like names mean the same as sky lanterns.

AN ORDINANCE CREATING § 12.03(13) OF
THE CHIPPEWA FALLS MUNICIPAL CODE
TO ALLOW FOR EMERGENCY ISSUANCE OF
CERTAIN TEMPORARY ALCOHOL LICENSES
AS ALLOWED BY THE WISCONSIN STATUTES.

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHIPPEWA FALLS, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN AS
FOLLOWS:

1. Section 125.26(1) of the Wisconsin Statutes provides that every municipal governing body may authorize an official of the municipality to issue temporary Class “B” licenses under § 125.26(6), Wisconsin Statutes.
2. Section 125.51(1)(a) of the Wisconsin Statutes provides that every municipal governing body may authorize an official of the municipality to issue temporary “Class B” licenses under § 125.51(10) of the Wisconsin Statutes.
3. Based upon the foregoing state statutes § 12.03(13) of the Chippewa Falls Municipal Code is hereby created to provide as follows:

(13) CITY CLERK AUTHORIZATION FOR TEMPORARY LICENSES.

It is recognized that organizations, bona fide clubs, and other entitled permittees to temporary alcohol licensing sometimes fail to timely apply for temporary alcohol licenses for which they qualify and this necessitates convening Special City Council Meetings in order to pass upon the temporary alcohol licensing request. In such situations the Chippewa Falls City Clerk is hereby authorized to determine the validity of the temporary alcohol licensing application and, if valid, issue the requested temporary alcohol license. This is limited to Class “B” licenses permitted under § 126.26(6), Wisconsin Statutes, and “Class B” license permitted under § 125.51(10), Wisconsin Statutes.

Such revocation shall be after affording the permit holder a hearing before the City Council after service on the permit holder of notice of hearing at least 3 days but not more than 30 days from the date and service of the notice and a detailed statement of the facts alleged to constitute any such violation.
